As one of the country's leading educational groups, and as a program of the National Association of Secondary School Principals (NASSP) which represents more than 30,000 school leaders including principals and assistant principals, the purpose of the NHS is to honor students who demonstrate excellence in the areas of scholarship, leadership, service, and character.

The National Honor Society is an institution dedicated to bringing out excellence in young adults, and I am proud to be a part of this important step in the lives of these youths, as they are inducted into this exclusive and elite society of young achievers,” stated Mayor Eugene W.
