Notice to fill Vacancy-Mayor

In accordance with the City of Seat Pleasant City Charter:

§ C-401 Qualifications of Mayor

The mayor must have resided in Seat Pleasant for at least one year immediately preceding his election and shall have been a qualified registered voter of the City for one year. The mayor shall maintain a permanent residence in the city during the term of office. The minimum age for the mayor shall be eighteen years of age.

The City of Seat Pleasant has a vacancy for the Office of the Mayor. Any resident that meets the above criteria and desires to be a candidate for the mayor position shall submit their letter of interest, resume and registered voter petitions, which shall include the names and signatures of at least twenty (20) registered voters in the City of Seat Pleasant to the Office of the City Clerk by 5:00p.m., Thursday, July 21, 2022. There will be NO EXCEPTIONS!

Blue Line Corridor Homeowner Rehabilitation Assistance Program

The Blue Line Corridor Homeowner Rehabilitation Assistance Program (BL-HRAP) can provide up to \$60,000 in health, safety, energy efficiency and accessibility repairs in qualified, owner-occupied homes in Prince George's County.



Services may include the following based on eligibility:

- Health Hazards:** Lead, mold and asbestos abatement
- Safety and Code Compliance Repairs:** Roof, electrical systems, plumbing, flooring
- Energy Efficiency:** Windows, insulation, air sealing, siding
- Accessibility-related Improvements:** Ramps, grab bars, railings
- Other improvements considered**

To be eligible, one must:

- Own and occupy a home along the Blue Line Corridor (HIP will verify)
- Be current on mortgage payments, property taxes and property insurance
- Not have an "underwater" mortgage or reverse mortgage
- Have a gross household income less than 80% of the uncapped Area Median Income (see chart below)
