A RESOLUTION concerning

THE DESIGNATION OF A COMMUNITY LEGACY AREA AND THE APPROVAL OF AN APPLICATION FOR, AND RECEIPT OF, FINANCING FOR A COMMUNITY LEGACY OR OTHER STATE REVITALIZATION PROGRAMS PROJECT(S) (THE PROJECT) FURTHER DESCRIBED IN THE APPLICATION DATED MAY 16, 2018 (THE APPLICATION), TO BE FINANCED EITHER DIRECTLY BY THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT OR THROUGH OTHER STATE DEPARTMENTS OR AGENCIES.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Seat Pleasant (the “City Council”) and the Mayor of the City of Seat Pleasant recognize that there is a significant need for reinvestment and revitalization of the communities in Prince George’s County, including the City of Seat Pleasant (the “City”); and

WHEREAS, the Department, either through Community Legacy, Community Legacy-Neighborhood Intervention, Strategic Demolition Fund, Baltimore Regional Neighborhood Initiative or other State Revitalization Programs or through other Programs of the Department, or in cooperation with other State departments or agencies, may provide some or all of the financing for the Project (the “Project Financing”) in order to assist in making it financially feasible; and

WHEREAS, the Project is located within a priority funding area under Section 5-7B-02 of the Smart Growth Act and the Project will conform to the local zoning code; and

WHEREAS, the applicable law and regulations require approval of the Project and the Project financing the City Council of the City of Seat Pleasant and, where appropriate, by the chief elected executive official of the City.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Mayor of the City of Seat Pleasant, as the chief elected executive official for the City, be and he is hereby requested to endorse his signature on this Resolution, thereby indicating his approval thereof; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Mayor and the City Council are hereby authorized to execute any and all documents and take any and all action necessary to carry out the intent of this Resolution; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT, upon adoption, copies of this Resolution shall be sent to the Secretary of the State Department of Housing and Community Development for consideration by the Community Legacy Board; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT this Resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.
